

Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6

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Thank you for choosing the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 by Payfro. This documentation will guide you through the installation, configuration and usage of the payment plugin. With this plugin, you can seamlessly integrate secure payment functionality into your Shopware 6 ecommerce platform.

Please note that this documentation assumes you have a working knowledge of Shopware 6 and its administration interface. If you encounter any difficulties or have questions during the installation or integration process, please don't hesitate to contact our support team for assistance.

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1. Introduction

The Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 by Payfro enables you to accept secure payments on your Shopware 6 store. With this plugin, you can offer seamless and secure payment options to your customers, enhancing their shopping experience.

2. Installation

Prerequisites

Before proceeding with the installation, please ensure that you have met the following prerequisites:

- Shopware 6.4+, or 6.5+, or 6.6+ is installed and running on your server.
- You have administrative access to the Shopware 6 backend.
- You have Twint sandbox and production credentials at hand.

Installation Steps

To install the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6, follow these steps:

- 1. Download the plugin package from the Payfro website.
- 2. Access your Shopware 6 backend administration panel.
- 3. Navigate to "Extensions" and select "My extensions".
- 4. Click on the "Upload extension" button and select the plugin zip file.
- 5. Once the upload is complete, click on "Install" to install the plugin.
- 6. After installation, activate the plugin and clear the cache.

Twint Credentials

Test Credentials

Contact Payfro to obtain sandbox API credentials.

Production Credentials

Please ensure you have the following information from your TWINT account:

- 1. Merchant Uuid (Production)
- 2. Cash Register Id

The Cash Register Id can be a sales channel or any value that allows you to identify the origin of a transaction. For example, WEBSITE_CH, etc

API Credentials Setup

To establish a connection with Twint's API, you need to set up API credentials. Follow these steps:

- 1. Log in to your shop backend.
- 2. Go to "Settings" and select "Extensions".
- 3. Locate the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 plugin and click on it.
- 4. Enter your API credentials provided by Twint (API key, secret key, etc.).
- 5. Save the configuration settings.

Twint Payment Method Configuration

Customize the payment methods of the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 plugin. Follow these steps:

- 1. Log in to your Shopware 6 backend.
- 2. Locate the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 plugin and click on it.
- 3. On the Twint configuration page click on "Configure payment methods".
- 4. Select the payment method you would like to customize.
- 5. Customize any additional settings or restrictions for each payment method.
- 6. Save the configuration settings.

Transaction Feedback & Webhooks Configuration

When dealing with payment service provider (PSP) integrations that necessitate the use of webhooks or transaction feedback, it's important to correctly configure these components to ensure smooth communication between systems. Below, you'll find the URL for configuring your webhooks or transaction feedback within your chosen PSP's environment:

Instructions:

PSP & Shop Backend

Webhooks and transaction feedback are crucial for maintaining accurate and timely information exchange between your system and the payment service provider. Follow these steps to configure the webhook listener URL:

1. **Access Configuration:** Log in to your PSP's administrative dashboard or control panel. Navigate to the settings or integration section where you can manage webhooks or transaction feedback.

2. **Enter Webhook URL:** In the provided field for webhook or transaction feedback URL, input the following URL:

```
https://{YOUR_DOMAIN}/api/_action/pyfr/twint/webhook/listener
Replace `YOUR_DOMAIN}` with the appropriate shop domain name.
```

- 3. Save Changes: After entering the URL, save your changes to ensure the configuration is applied.
- 4. **Test the Configuration:** To ensure the webhook setup is successful, perform a test transaction or trigger a webhook event as specified by your PSP's documentation. Monitor the transaction status to confirm that data is being successfully transmitted between your system and the PSP.

Shop Server

Transaction feedback can also be handled via scheduled tasks. This allows your shop to query your PSP for transaction updates.

To schedule the plugin to query your PSP by running Shopware scheduled tasks. Please refer to the Shopware documentation. For your convenience we provide this example:

```
crontab -l -u www-data | { cat; echo "*/15 * * * * /usr/bin/php
${SHOPWARE_INSTALL_DIR}/bin/console scheduled-task:run --no-wait"; } | crontab --
```

By setting up your webhook or transaction feedback configuration using the provided URL, you'll establish a reliable communication channel that enables real-time updates between your system and the payment service provider. This will help ensure that you're always up-to-date with transaction status, order changes, and other critical data related to your payment processes.

4. Integration

Checkout Process Integration

To integrate the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 payment plugin into the checkout process, follow these steps:

- 1. Access your Shopware 6 backend.
- 2. Nagivate to "Sale Channels" and select the sales channel you wish to configure.
- 3. Go to "Payment and shipping" and select "Payment Methods."
- 4. Select the payment method you would like to utilise.
- 5. Save the configuration settings.


Order Management Integration

To handle captures, refunds and cancellations using the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 payment plugin, follow these steps:

- 1. Access the Shopware 6 backend.
- 2. Go to "Orders" and select "Overview".

- 3. Locate an order and click on an number under the column "Order number".
- 4. Navigate to the Twint tab.
- 5. Over the Twint tab you can Capture, Refund or Cancel payment.

Transaction State Diagram



The transaction state diagram maps out the state flow on transactions.

5. Testing and Debugging Sandbox Environment Setup

For testing purposes, set up a sandbox environment. Follow these steps:

- 1. Access the Shopware 6 backend.
- 2. Go to "Settings" and select "Extensions".
- 3. Locate the Twint Payment Extension for Shopware 6 plugin and click on it.
- 4. Switch to the sandbox environment and enter the sandbox API credentials.
- 5. Save the configuration settings.

Test Cases and Scenarios

Perform various test cases and scenarios to ensure proper functionality. Consider the following scenarios:

- · Successful payments.
- Failed payments.
- Payment Captures, Refunds and Cancellations.
- Handling error cases.
- · Verifying order and payment status updates.
